Looking To 2021

It would only be natural to say goodbye to 2020 with a retrospective on what a difficult year it has been. I've certainly read a lot of Christmas letters that have done so and even written some newsletters and preached some sermons of my own with the same sentiment. Such reflections are no doubt going to continue to be important as we grieve what was lost and reflect on how we might take on a pandemic the proportion of COVID-19 in the future.

However, I think the time has come to begin looking forward to 2021 and beyond. The past year of quarantine and working, schooling, shopping, and worshipping online has most likely awakened us to some things we've taken for granted, some things that we can let go of, and some things that we want to change, and some things we never want to repeat. Our future has been forever changed and reshaped by the past year as is always the case — even if most often in much smaller and less profound ways — but this turning of years seems to hold a unique significance for us.

So, what does looking forward mean even as we continue to be in the throes of a viral pandemic. For starters, I think it means taking some time to reflect on our hopes for this next year. It certainly means thinking about family, career, and personal goals, but I am the pastor of a worshipping community and this is after all a church newsletter; so it must mean some reflection on what we hope church to be in 2021.

Although 2021 holds hope of gathering again for worship in our sanctuary that reunion is still sometime off. My thoughts turn to what we want our church to be even as we are still virtual and our activities will be curtailed for the winter and spring. How will we stay connected as a community? What needs to change so we can engage more with our community? How can we start reconnecting even before we worship in person? We've been without a Sunday School for 7 months, what will it take to get restarted? I know most of our session members are looking to get support for the areas of church life they are focused on be it finances, spiritual formation, worship, congregational care and fellowship or whatever.

It is my hope that as we escape 2020 for 2021 we are less concerned with running away from a hard year than we are with running into the new thing that God is doing among us. I pray that we will all find fresh engagement and investment in our life together, imagine new ways to connect, and new means of sharing God's grace with our neighbors.

May we prioritize our worshipping community even as we await the time we will gather in person. And may the words of the Apostle Paul sustain us,

Rejoice in the Lord always; again I will say, Rejoice. Let your gentleness be known to everyone. The Lord is near. Do not worry about anything, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God. And the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus.
