Shalom

As we begin a third year facing COVID-19 with high case rates and over taxed hospital systems it can certainly feel like we've been here before.


I continue to be grateful to our session for their conscientiousness and thoughtfulness throughout the pandemic especially in response to the recent surge in cases of due to the Omicron variant. No one is particularly thrilled with church online (especially since most of us have spent too much time during this pandemic in front of screens already), but we are trying to make the most of these challenging times. At this point we expect to be closed for worship and other in person gatherings for at least 2 more weeks. When the session meets on January 18 we'll look at all the data from our area and discuss a plan for moving forward for the rest of January and February.

There seems to be some hope that this latest surge of cases will subside as quickly as it rolled in.

You may have noticed that this time around we've changed our platform and format for virtual worship. We are now on Facebook Live each Sunday morning at 10am with a live broadcast and an abbreviated worship service. The recorded service is available afterwards on the church Facebook page. During Advent and Christmas Tide our worship was centered on *Peace* or more accurately *Shalom* (the Hebrew word we translate as "peace"). I enjoyed the challenge of thinking about this important biblical concept and I certainly hope we can continue to consider the many ways we, as a church, are called to have *peace*, in all its fullness, at the center of our mission and calling. There are many ways that we might choose to be peacemakers in 2022.

I've never been much for new year resolutions, but if I had to make some for 2022 I think I'd be interested in finding new ways to bring peace to the troubled times in which we are living. Of course, by peace, I don't mean new breathing techniques, a plan to declutter, or making more time for myself (all things that would be good to do). I'd be looking for ways to more responsibly live in harmony with creation while pursuing justice for the disenfranchised and forgotten. I've come to understand that there is a direct line from Scripture's celebration of God's creation and the constant call for justice for the most vulnerable to the concept of *Shalom*. All our choices affect peace.



Jesus began his ministry, which he entrusted to his disciples and so to us, with the words of Isaiah the prophet,

“The Spirit of the Lord is upon me,
because he has anointed me
to bring good news to the poor.
He has sent me to proclaim release to the captives
and recovery of sight to the blind,
to let the oppressed go free,
to proclaim the year of the Lord’s favor.” (Luke 4:18-19)

The image that Jesus is picking up on, when considered in its fullness, is a *shalom* picture. When all these things are happening we’re moving toward true peace. When we find creative ways to take up the work of Christ and bear his burdens we begin to get a glimpse of hoped for peace.

May we each find and share God’s peace in 2022.
